

EU policy towards the "East": the Eastern Partnership initiative

- As with Russia, the EU is moving to strengthen ties with 6 other countries: Georgia, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Moldova, Ukraine and Belarus.
- The plan calls for increased funding for these countries and offers them the prospect of free-trade agreements if they undertake political and economic reforms as they all face important challenges to democracy and the rule of law.
- The EU is also concerned about stability in the region after the August 2008 Russia-Georgia war, which ended in an EU-brokered ceasefire.

- General
- Erasmus Mundus offers financial support for institutions and scholarships for individuals (http://ec.europa.eu/education/external-relation-programmes/doc72_en.htm);
- Tempus supports the modernization of higher education in the Partner Countries of Eastern Europe, Central Asia, the Western Balkans and the Mediterranean region, mainly through university cooperation projects (http://eacea.ec.europa.eu/tempus/index_en.php);
- Non-state Actors and Local authorities: Commission's thematic programme supporting the right of initiative of non-state actors and local authorities by funding their initiatives when geographical programmes are not the appropriate instrument and by supplementing the support that other sectoral thematic programmes can provide. The 3 main areas of intervention are:
 - 1. actions in developing countries and regions,
 - awareness raising and education in Europe on the subject of development,
 - and measures facilitating the coordination between civil society networks and local authorities.

EU Programs and Initiatives for RoA (2)

2. Regional:

- Eastern Partnership = a new partnership to strengthen relations between EU and 6 partner countries. Bilateral offer:
 - New contractual relations (FTAs);
 - Gradual integration into the EU economy;
 - 3. Easier travel to the EU;
 - 4. Energy security cooperation;
 - 5. Regional development;
- ENPI (European Neighbourhood Policy Instrument) → ENPI National Indicative Programme for the RoA 2011-2013

- 3. Local → Agreement on Partnership and Co-operation (PCA) whose principal targets are:
 - to provide EU-Armenia cooperation by developing political relations,
 - to provide the respect of democratic principles, the rule of law, human rights and the transition to a market economy,
 - to provide trade relations between the sides as well as legal, social, economic, financial, scientific, civil and cultural relationship and partnership.

3. NATO & Armenia

- 1992 Armenia joins the newly created North Atlantic Cooperation Council (EAPC in 1997)
- 1994 Armenia joins the Partnership for Peace (PfP)
- 2003 Armenia hosts the PfP exercise "Cooperative Best Effort 2003"

- 2004 At the Istanbul Summit, allied leaders place special focus on the Caucasus – a special NATO representative and a liaison officer are assigned to the region;
- 2006 A NATO information Centre is officially opened in Yerevan.



Fields of Cooperation agreed in the Armenian Individual Partnership Action Plan

IPAP:

- Jointly agreed for a 2year period;
- Geared towards to:
 - → strengthening political dialogue between NATO and Armenia;
 - → supporting Armenia's democratic and defence reforms.





 - <u>Investment opportunities</u>: *InvestInItaly* is an institutional organisation for the promotion of foreign investments in Italy, and is the only place to find free specialised consulting services aimed at facilitating the connection process for foreign investors in Italy (<u>www.investinitaly.com</u>).
